- The largest snowflake on record measured 15 inches across and fell in Montana in 1887.
- All snowflakes have six sides but no two are exactly alike.
- In 1921, Silver Lake, Colorado, experienced the biggest snowfall in a 24-hour period in United States history - a whopping 76 inches!
- The coldest temperature ever recorded was set in Antarctica at -136 degrees Fahrenheit.
- On average, snowflakes fall at a speed of 3.1 miles per hour.

The world's tallest snowman was built in February 2008 in Bethel, Maine, and measured 122 feet, 1 inch tall!
